This year marks the final year of EducationPlannerBC's 2021-2024 Strategic Plan. The plan aligns with our mandate to deliver and respond to opportunities within British Columbia's post-secondary system. EducationPlannerBC is pleased to share a snapshot of notable accomplishments aligned to each area of our strategic focus.

Promote Access

Launched Find Your Path, a program and career planning tool, on EducationPlannerBC's website.

Completed a full website refresh, with new features and tools including My List.

Conducted website service design research to inform user experience optimization.

Lead sector-wide nursing applicant research to identify underlying trends in applicant behaviour.

Launched the StrongerBC future skills grant centralized program listing site.

Established the provincial micro-credential registry.

Broadened the French language programming initiative including partnership and parent engagement with Canadian Parents for French.

Delivered an expanded private institution service model with eight institutions now under contract.

Expanded engagement outreach to focus on diversity, supported Langley Settlement Workers in Schools and Ukrainian refugees.

Foster integration

Migrated 11 additional post-secondary institutions to EPBC3 for a total of 16.

Collaborated with BCIT to onboard to EducationPlannerBC's application service.

Enhanced the self-service functionality in management console to provide post-secondary institutions more flexibility and control in managing their systems.

Added the two largest Alberta post-secondary institutions to Ministry of Education and Child Care transcript delivery.

Presented at Western Association of Registrars of the Universities and Colleges of Canada (WARUCC) on breadth of EducationPlannerBC support services for students and post-secondary institutions.

Co-authored the CanPESC white paper, *Creating Predictable Pathways for Postsecondary Electronic Standards Council XML Standards*.

Piloted "Post-Secondary Transcript Testing Week" to support post-secondary institution development.


Launched a communication portal to support the BC Associate Registrars and Managers Association (BCARMA).


Website refresh

High school presentations

The presentations guide students through their planning, searching, and applying stages, supporting the idea that every journey looks a little different. Students are introduced to education and career options, financial support and student services, and are given a walk through of EducationPlannerBC's website to learn where to find resources, search for programs, save programs on My List, and how to apply to post-secondary education in British Columbia.

Highlights

EducationPlannerBC partnered with the Langley School District's Settlement Workers in Schools to customize a post-secondary program and career engagement session to support the integration of newcomer students and their families to British Columbia.

The presentation introduced our website application and resources, and shared valuable information such as credential options, adult upgrading, English language education, and financial assistance. The in-person session reached 50 grade 10-12 students and their families.



French language programming

EducationPlannerBC received approval to extend our French Language Programming work through May 2026. This program has been successfully developing since 2022 when EducationPlannerBC was contracted to manage a new two-year government-funded initiative to increase participation in French language programs and French teacher education in B.C.'s public post-secondary institutions.

The goal is to expand awareness and support participation in B.C.'s post-secondary French language programs by informing students enrolled in Francophone, French Immersion, and Core French programs, as well as their families, of the range of French language education opportunities and associated career paths.

The Client Relations team provides a point of contact for each post-secondary institution partner, focused on relationship management, project coordination, and technical support. As the landscape of post-secondary continues to evolve, this role ensures proactive and ongoing communication and support. Client Relations works with post-secondary institutions to identify their needs, develop plans, and support successful integration and use of EducationPlannerBC's products and services.

Through the work of Client Relations, EducationPlannerBC has been able to successfully support the varying needs of post-secondary partners. Most recently, EducationPlannerBC onboarded BCIT to its application service and support, which will bring a large number of new applicants onto EducationPlannerBC's website to apply to post-secondary education.


